

## *The George Hallas Memorial FORCC Scholarships*

### *Description*

**The Fellowship of Orthodox Churches of Connecticut** (FORCC) seeks to unite the Orthodox Churches in Connecticut to work together to promote the Orthodox Faith throughout the state. As a part of this mission, the **Fellowship** offers scholarships to two qualified candidates each year. In 2018, these scholarships were dedicated to the memory of one of the founding members of FORCC, the late George Hallas.

The **George Hallas Memorial FORCC Scholarships** are offered to two young Orthodox Christians entering college or university for the first time and who are parishioners of any of the member Churches of **FORCC**. With a value of \$1,000.00 each, they recognize the academic achievement and parish involvement of the recipients.

A special *Scholarship Committee* is appointed each year by the **FORCC** governing board to examine all applications received and award the scholarships. All applications and any accompanying information is kept in the strictest confidence.

## *The George Hallas Memorial FORCC Scholarships*

### *Guidelines*

*All applications must include:*

1. An official transcript from the high school from which the student is graduating or, in the case of those who are home-schooled, the results of any standardized tests required for college admission. These must be supplied by the school or testing agency and must be postmarked by *June 1, 2018*. Transcripts and test results should be sent to: Scholarship Chairperson Alexia Tassmer at the address listed above.
2. An essay of not more than 150 words, typed or clearly hand-written in ink, introducing yourself to the Scholarship Committee. Explain your educational and vocational plans and any civic and church involvement or extra activities.
3. A wallet size photograph for publication.
4. The Scholarship Application Form and the Parish Participation Form.
5. Any references from faculty members, your parish Priest, and any supporting documents, etc.

### **Eligibility**

1. The applicant must be an Orthodox Christian and an active participant in his or her parish.
2. The applicant must be entering an accredited four-year college or university for the first time, as a full-time student.
3. No applicant will be disqualified if another member of the family has previously been awarded this Scholarship.

### **Basis of Selection**

The Scholarship Committee will consider all applications, attached documents and transcripts submitted to make its decision, which will be final. The contents of all applications will remain confidential.

### **Scholarship Awards**

Two \$1,000.00 (One Thousand Dollar) Scholarships will be awarded from the Scholarship Fund to the best qualified applicants.
